

Student Bursaries: How students can access funding to support academic success

PP students are allocated a £50 Bursary at the start of every academic year. This is to cover the cost of most essential items needed for school e.g. uniform - we will provide one of each uniform item, e.g. one school jumper, one tie, one PE top etc. per student. School equipment – e.g. maths packs, stationary set, revision packs, revision books etc. This £50 is for the academic year and is available for each child, we are not able to share the funding between siblings. If there are any funds remaining by the end of the summer term the funding will not be 'rolled over'.

This funding is separate to the funding of school meals.







Alongside the £50 allocation of funding for each PP student, we will have a discretionary fund available if there are additional essential items needed. For the discretionary funding attendance and attitude to studies will be considered as part of the request. We also have educational visit funding to support student accessing the curriculum and allowing them to go on curriculum based school visits.

The intent of the disadvantaged strategy is to 'level the playing field' for <u>all</u> disadvantaged pupils within the school to ensure that they have a greater chance of success in life and to act as a springboard for social mobility.
