How can I tell if I'm gay / lesbian or straight?



Write down all the gorgeous film stars you can think of. What sex are they?

No, seriously!

Sorry about that. Seriously, it may be too early to tell one way or the other. Some people's sexual orientation only settles down quite late in the teens. Aim to feel secure in what you are. If you feel confused, say "OK, my hormones are confused. I'll manage to live with that till things settle down".

Can you change from being straight to being gay, or the other way round?

People do change, especially in our teens. We can't make it happen on purpose.

I think my brother's gay. What should I do?

How about Nothing? Isn't it totally his own business whether he's gay or not?

But I don't think he's happy about it.

If he seems worried about something, then it might be to do with sexuality, or it might

be something totally different. If you're really worried about him, you could simply ask him what's on his mind...?

Why am I gay? My parents think it has to be someone's fault.

Well, it happens. It's got nothing to do with the way people are brought up, and it's not a choice you've made. No-one's done anything to make it happen. Have your parents asked themselves what it was that made them straight? Very important: there's no question of "fault"! Growing up gay or lesbian or bisexual is just as good and natural and ordinary (and special) as growing up straight.

I haven't done it once yet! Is there something wrong?

In a word, No! You're fine. Don't have sex till you feel it's right for you.

I'm gay, and I need to find out about safer sex.

Ask your school nurse, or ring one of the information lines inside this leaflet. Everyone who has sex should do safer sex, whether we're straight, gay, lesbian or bisexual. There are some really nasty infections around like HIV and chlamydia, and they can affect anyone and everyone—boys and girls, straight and gay.

My family's religious. So am I. And I'm lesbian. It's really difficult for me.

Religion is a very personal thing. It can be difficult to bring together what you are, and what you believe. We can't give a simple answer. But there are many lesbian or gay people in the UK who are also very committed Christians, Muslims, Jews, and Sikhs. They've found a way. It might help to talk to one of the helplines in this leaflet.

Hey, I'm gay, and I've got no problems at all.

Good for you.
