Entry Requirements

For entry onto Level 3:

- You need to have achieved at least 5 A* - C grades at GCSE or equivalent in separate subjects.
- The normal expectation is for you to have achieved a **grade B at GCSE (or equivalent) in the subject you wish to continue to study at AS level**, a grade C will be accepted only at the school's discretion. [Exceptions are AS Applied Science, Media and Health & Social Care which have C grade entry at GCSE as standard].
- **BTEC/Cambridge Technical** courses require a minimum of a **grade C** (or equivalent).
- If you have **not previously studied a subject at Level 2**, then a related subject or your English/Maths grade will be used. You need to discuss this with the relevant Curriculum Area Leader beforehand.

Subjects new at Level 3

- **AS Psychology** requires a grade B in GCSE Science and a grade B in GCSE Maths
- **AS Photography** requires a B grade in GCSE Art (or equivalent). Students who have not studied Art at level 2 are required to present a photographic portfolio
- **BTEC Travel and Tourism** requires a grade C in Geography if this subject was taken at GCSE
- **AS Further Maths** requires an A* in GCSE Maths (A*/A in Further Maths if taken at GCSE)

The normal expectation is for you to have achieved a **grade C in GCSE English and Maths**. There is provision for re-sit GCSE English and Maths alongside a Level 3 programme.

In addition some subjects have additional GCSE English, Maths and Science requirements:

- **AS Business Studies** requires a grade B or above in Maths
- **BTEC Business Studies** requires a grade C in Maths
- **AS ICT** requires a grade C or above Maths.
- **ICT Cambridge Technical** requires a grade C or above in Maths.

Additional Entry Requirements

Work ethic and commitment to studying will form an integral part of the Wadebridge Sixth Form application. **It is therefore essential that students display a dedication to reaching their KS4 target grades.** Our Level 3 programme is not a suitable option for students who significantly underachieve at KS4 due to a lack of commitment displayed to their studies as a whole.
