


Key findings

The Programme of Study is designed to allow choice. 4 subjects is therefore the norm nationally

ALPs advise that 3 subjects is to be considered for students with average GCSE of 41-43 (C lower to middle)

The first 2 to 3 weeks allows reflection on the subjects chosen to ENSURE students are on the correct courses that offer greatest potential for their success and progression.



Time line

 New AS and A levels were taught in schools in England from September 2015. The first results for the new AS levels were in 2016, and for the A levels in 2017.

 Subjects have been introduced onto the new system in phases. Further details later.....

What does the new A level system look like?

- Will be a linear 2 year course with final grades coming at the end of Year 13
- AS results no longer count towards the A level
- AS level exam can still be taken at the end of Year 12 where relevant

 degree of non-exam assessment will reflect balance and nature of new subject content. Assessment will be mainly by exam, with other types of assessment used only where they are needed to test essential skills.

- Grades stay the same A*-E
- performance standards stay the same







Post-16 Work Experience

Professor Alison Wolf's report about Vocational Education recommended an increase in provision of work experience amongst students of 16 years and older. This reflects changes in education and employment patterns. Work experience post-16 can be tailored to reflect the student's prior attainment and career aspirations as they mature into adulthood. There is good evidence that both young people and employers find it mutually beneficial, helping young people prepare for employment, improve their attainment and make informed decisions about their future beyond education.
