Entry Requirements/Student Suitability:

Students are required to reach the Wadebridge Sixth Form Level 3 entry criteria. In addition, a Grade B or above in Religious Education and English Language is required.

Methods of Study:

Debates/discussion on up-to-date ethical issues, relevant videos/documentaries/news articles, group work on presentations/posters, creative revision techniques and practice exam questions.

Assessment: 100% examination

3 x 75 minute exams (AS Level) 3 x 2 hour exams (A Level)

Independent Study Time:

A successful RS student will have a keen interest in, and desire to understand, human diversity, different cultures and world views. They should have an enquiring, critical and reflective approach, and be willing to evaluate different systems for determining what is right and what is wrong! They should also be keen to debate current ethical issues and reflect on their own values, opinions and attitudes.

Students are expected to keep up-to-date with developments and laws surrounding the ethical issues studied - e.g. by studying the news and relevant documentaries. They will also need to develop their knowledge of Buddhism, and its relation to the wider world, through independent research from books and the internet. As well as this, they will need to complete practice exam questions on a regular basis to develop writing and communication skills.

Progression and the Future:

RS is conducive to a number of higher education courses; such as English, History, Sociology, Philosophy and Politics. In RS you will develop skills of investigation, analysis, interpretation, evaluation, communication and These are useful in a number of careers; from teaching or youth work, to journalism or government. If you are thinking of a career in Law or Medicine, then an RS A-Level is looked upon favourably. In addition, RS is an obvious benefit to anyone who wishes to work or travel abroad.
