Entry Requirements/Student Suitability:

Students are required to reach the Wadebridge Sixth Form Level 3 entry criteria. In addition you should relish reading independently and you should enjoy creative writing. The course will build on skills from the English Language GCSE.

Course Content: AS Level

Paper1 Exam 1 hour 30mins Language and the Individual (50% AS)

Analysis of two texts linked by topic/theme and a comparison of the two.

Paper 2: Exam 1 hour 30 Language varieties (50% AS)

Essay on language diversity. Directed writing task on attitudes towards language.

<u>A Level</u>

<u>Paper 1</u> – Exam – 2 hours 30 minutes – Language, the Individual and Society (40%) Comparison of how texts use language, e.g. in advertising/websites.

Examination of language development in children e.g. Primary school students' writing.

Paper 2 – Exam – 2 hours 30 minutes – Language Diversity and Change (40%) Essay on how language varies according to the

speaker and the context.

Comparison of 2 texts in terms of how they use language, followed by an opinion article.

Coursework 3500 words (**20%**) Investigate an area of language use e.g. Genre/ function/attitudes/user-based.

Original writing: either to persuade, story-telling or information.

Methods of Study:

Classroom discussion. Group work. Independent Research. Practice exam papers Textual analysis

Independent Study Time:

Collating support material from websites and study guides will help develop an understanding of the socio/historical contexts in which texts were produced.
