YEAR 9 INTO 10 GCSE ART SUMMER HOMEWORK

Complete all the following tasks;

- Make a collection of images of Cornwall for a collage, enough to fill an A3 sheet of paper. Use the internet to print some, pick up free leaflets from tourist information racks on places of interest (Tesco in Wadebridge has one by the tills!) cut up an old Cornwall calendar, postcards etc etc.
- Take, & print out, at least 12 good quality photos of the Cornish landscape. Try to get some variety in the range of photos that you take (sea, beach, cliffs, surfers, beach huts, moorland, rural buildings, old tin mines, harbours, churches etc. not all 12 of the same bit of beach!)
- From one of your photos do an A3 sized piece of work (drawing or painting) that shows your skills.
- In rough make a list of as many things you can think of to do with the theme of 'Cornwall'
- Go to a local gallery/artist's studio & pick up some information on at least one local (Cornish) artist that you like. Get leaflets, pamphlets, post-cards etc.
- Sit & draw a pencil sketch, on A3 paper, of a section of your garden pencil tone or pencil colour.
- Bring all of the following in on the first day back assume you have art that day. We need them in that first lesson to work from.

(NB - use the paper up in your Y9 art sketchbook, we can tear it out to put into your new folder in September, but only use one side of the paper. This work will form part of your coursework which is worth 60% of your final GCSE mark so make sure it's good quality & not left until the night before we come back!)







<u>Art equipment you will need in</u> <u>September;</u>

Essential as a GCSE art student; good rubber, HB pencil, 2B or 4B pencil, double sharpener, 30cm ruler. Preferable as a GCSE art student; set of 12 good quality coloured pencil/ watercolour pencil crayons, brushes, small pan of watercolour paints, a set of very fine coloured fine-liner pens. *Have a great holiday!*
