



Flash Cards



WHAT IS IT?

Small cards with key terms on one side, and their definitions on the back.

WHEN WOULD I USE IT?

- When there are specific terms/keywords that you must know.
- For 'define', 'state' or 'identify' questions.
- Make them **pocket-sized** to use on the go.
- You can usually buy flashcards very cheap in supermarkets or you can buy some card and make your own 😊

HOW DO I MAKE/USE ONE?

1. Decide which key words/phrases you will need to understand the meaning of for your assessment.
2. Write these on one side of a card (one per card).
3. Write the definition on the back of the card.
4. Test yourself:
 - Read the key word, and say the definition out loud or in your head. If you are correct, put it in a pile, if your are not correct, return it to the back of your flash card pile.
5. Have others test you:
 - They read you the key term and you respond with the definition or they read the definition and you say the word 😊

VARIATIONS

- You may want to colour code your flash cards for particular topics.
- It doesn't just have to be definitions - you could **have questions on one side** and answers on the back.

EXAMPLES...



Poverty	Being poor, not having your basic needs met (e.g. food, water, shelter)
Agape	Unconditional love for all people - you love them no matter what and even if they have done wrong.
Stewardship	This is the Christian belief that God has given humans the responsibility to look after the world and everything in it for Him.
Sanctity of life	This is the Christian belief that all life is precious and holy because it was given by God.
