

Students are required to produce work from given starting points that demonstrates a range of methods, techniques and processes, whilst experimenting and recording their ideas.

Students will also need to show the development of their ideas, which have been informed by the study of different photographers and artists that leads to well presented final images.

#### Component No 1 - Externally Set Task (10 hours) = 100% weighting for AS

Students will be given an exam paper around 1st January. This exam paper will have a choice of starting points, from which their will pick one to produce a well researched thorough body of work and then prepare materials for a 10 hour exam This element is worth 100% of your overall AS grade.

# Component No 1 - Personal Investigation = 60% of total A Level

This requires students to follow the same procedure in developing a personal response, but to a self chosen starting point. As part of the component you will be required to submit a written element of min 1000 - 3000 words.

#### Component No'2 - Externally Set Task Examination (15 hours) = 40% of total A Level

#### Methods of Study:

Demonstrations, presentations, group work, critique, 1-1 tutorial, research of different photographers techniques and equipment, looking at different photographers images, practicing exam questions.

#### Independent Study Time:

A successful Photography student will have an interest in regularly recording their observations and generating project ideas through independent research outside of lessons, in order to extend their learning skills. Reading photography books and magazines, watching relevant films and browsing the internet, whatever the source, if the content is related to the projects set, it will help to develop understanding and provide a broader knowledge of the subject.

Students will be given the opportunity to complete practice exam assignments and to experience working alongside other practitioner's plus specific photographic trips. Specific homework tasks will be set on a regular basis. Coursework will be assessed regularly and allow us to monitor progress and feedback strategies for improvement to the students work.

#### Progression and the Future:

Photography is all about capturing a precise moment in order to present an image that conveys response and meaning.

Photography is a popular and competitive subject on its own and has links to other subjects like Fashion, Graphic Design, Illustration, Film and Media.

There are numerous related jobs with Photography, including Wedding Photography, Commercial, Press, Nature, Film, Food, Publishing, Portraiture, Studio and Travel.
