We hope you will be very happy with us and we look forward to meeting you again.



TUTOR TIME-

The Tutor Programmes for all years have been developed to assist students in the development of high aspirations and other careers skills. Students are given a variety of careers education as well as individual advice and guidance.

LRC (Learning Resource Centre) -The LRC is open each day from 8.00am and is supervised by our staff for use by students during the school day.

EXTRA CURRICULAR - We welcome all students of any experience or ability to come along to our various sports clubs. Examples of activities include Rowing, Badminton, Netball, Football, Just Dance and Girls Active. The activities available change each term (10-14 weeks). Teams can be selected from the students who are interested in representing the school but our clubs are also available to students who simply want to be active. We advertise the club list at the start of each term via Classcharts, through tutors and a list will always be available on the PE office door and in changing rooms. There is no fee for our clubs and you do not need to sign up; simply turn up to the venue listed on the club list in suitable sports clothing, ready to join in. We look forward to seeing you there.

There is also an array of musical opportunities that are advertised throughout the year outside the music department, as well as a Year 7 STEM club and Lego club.


