TUTOR TIME-

The Tutor Programmes for all years have been developed to assist students in the development of high aspirations and other careers skills. Students are given a variety of careers education as well as individual advice and guidance.

LRC (Learning Resource Centre) -The LRC is open each day from 8.00am and is supervised by our staff for use by students during the school day.

EXTRA CURRICULAR - We welcome all students of any experience or ability to come along to our various sports clubs. Examples of activities include Rowing, Badminton, Netball, Football, Just Dance and Girls Active. The activities available change each term (10-14 weeks). Teams can be selected from the students who are interested in representing the school but our clubs are also available to students who simply want to be active. We advertise the club list at the start of each term via Classcharts, through tutors and a list will always be available on the PE office door and in changing rooms. There is no fee for our clubs and you do not need to sign up; simply turn up to the venue listed on the club list in suitable sports clothing, ready to join in. We look forward to seeing you there.

There is also an array of musical opportunities that are advertised throughout the year outside the music department, as well as a Year 7 STEM club and Lego club.

BREAKS & LUNCH TIMES:

Junior Canteen- Year 7 & 8 Quiet areas Senior Canteen- Year 9, 10 & 11 LRC access Senior playground and the tennis courts The canteens focus on healthy eating. There is food available for during break time as well as the main lunch time.

There are spaces for students who bring their own packed lunch in the canteen and quiet areas.




You will get a student and parent login for Class Charts which will show:




Induction Day:


When will I get my bus pass?



You will have a pass from September which you will need to show on each journey. You will be told at Primary school which bus to catch, where you meet and at what time.

Where should I catch my bus from at the end of each day?

All buses will wait in the bus bay until 3.10pm every day, giving you 10 minutes from the end of the school day to get on the bus...so no need to panic about missing your bus! You will be shown where to wait on induction day.



Don't panic or worry. See the teachers on bus duty and they will take you to the office to arrange for you to get home safely.

What should I do if I have problems on the bus?

There are bus monitors on each bus who will make sure that all pupils behave sensibly. If you are not happy though you should speak to your form tutor or member of the Key Stage 3 Team.





How is homework set?

Homework will be set on ClassCharts, an online home learning tool which you will be given a login for. Parents also have access. The length of time you should spend on the homework task set, the task itself and the deadline date will be outlined on ClassCharts.



What should I do if I don't understand the class work?

Ask your teacher or teaching assistant – don't panic!

Our uniform consists of the following :

- · Black Jumper/cardigan with School logo
- · Black trousers (Black jeans or jean styled trousers with rivets or patch style back pockets, black chinos, leggings, jeggings <u>do not</u> meet our uniform code)

 \cdot Wadebridge School black shorts from our supplier only. No other shorts will be permitted. Shorts may be worn all year round.

- Knee-length Black Skirt for girls which includes the school logo 3 styles to choose from.
- \cdot White Shirt which has a top button—Not Polo Shirts
- · Black & Gold striped clip-on tie (Y7-10) also available to buy in school
- · Plain black shoes or trainers (no markings or white soles)
- · Black socks / black tights
- · One set of stud earrings and a watch are the only jewellery permitted
- · Hair must be of a 'normal' colour
