



## Awarding 2021 Grades



*In summer 2021, exam boards will ask exam centres to generate, for each subject, teacher assessed grades for their students, this includes components of Technical Awards that would have normally been assessed in 2021. These grades should be based on a range of evidence completed as part of the course, including evidence produced in the coming months, which demonstrates the student's performance on the subject content they have been taught. The grades submitted to exam boards must reflect a **fair, reasonable and carefully considered judgement** of the student's performance across a range of evidence, on the curriculum content that they have been taught.*

This document outlines the evidence that will be used in each the components various Technical Awards that would normally have been assessed this year for Year 10 students. along with the total number of marks that are available and how much each piece of assessment, evidence contributes to the total. Where a student has missed or significantly under-performed in one assessment a compensatory mark can be awarded in line with the student's performance in other assessments.

We are awaiting final clarification from the exam board, who have given us this guidance:

*We recognise and anticipate that mid-flight learners due to certificate next year will have been impacted by a different level of disruption than those completing this year. We also understand that learners and centres are keen to know unit level results to make decisions, but as we do not yet know what the situation we will be next year, our decision is to ensure that we do the right thing by learners and take the time to review the situation next academic year, and take the impact into account at the point of certification for these learners. In light of this we can confirm that we will request Qualification-level or Unit-level Teacher Assessed Grades for mid-flight learners, at the appropriate point of certification next academic year.*
