
# Revision Don't Panie

It is important to take all exams in earnest since mocks are good indicators of how you will fare in the summer and how you fare in the summer will determine the post 16 options available to you.


It will also allow you assess if your approach to revision worked!!!

- Letters sent home with set-up details and guidance also on school websites under "Our School"






# Behaviours & Achievements

Message from Miss Yardley, Headteacher


