



In summer 2021, exam boards will ask exam centres to generate, for each subject, teacher assessed grades for their students. These grades should be based on a range of evidence completed as part of the course, including evidence produced in the coming months, which demonstrates the student's performance on the subject content they have been taught. The grades submitted to exam boards must reflect a **fair, reasonable and carefully considered judgement** of the student's performance across a range of evidence, on the curriculum content that they have been taught.

As part of their overall quality assurance, centres should consider the grades for this year's cohort compared to cohorts from previous years when exams have taken place. For centres with relatively large and stable cohorts, this historical data can provide a useful guide to the expected profile of results and enables centres to check that they have not been overly harsh or lenient in their assessment of the 2021 cohort compared to previous years.

This document outlines the evidence that will be used in each subject area, along with the total number of marks that are available and how much each piece of assessment, evidence contributes to the total. Where a student has missed or significantly under-performed in one assessment a compensatory mark can be awarded in line with the student's performance in other assessments. The total scores for each subject cohort will be anonymised and used in rank order to help determine grade boundaries to reflect the school's results in previous years, these grades will then be crossed referenced with exam board guidance before the final grades are determined.

NB. these arrangements are subject to change following the publication of exam board guidance in March.
